

BY-LAW NO. 99

A BY-LAW OF THE NEW TOWN OF
RAINBOW LAKE TO PROHIBIT THE KEEPING OF
WILD OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS OR POULTRY

WHEREAS the New Town of Rainbow Lake wishes to prohibit the keeping of wild or domestic animals or poultry, and to prevent the leading, riding and driving of cattle or horses in any public place within the boundaries of the New Town of Rainbow Lake.

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the power conferred upon it by Section 161, subsections (a) and (e) of the Municipal Government Act being Chapter 246 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970, and amendments thereto, the Board of Administrators of the New Town of Rainbow Lake duly assembled as follows:

- 1) The keeping by any person of wild or domestic animals (excepting dogs and cats) or poultry within the boundaries of the New Town of Rainbow Lake is prohibited.
- 2) The leading, riding and riving of cattle or horses in any public place in the boundaries of the New Town of Rainbow Lake is prohibited.
- 3) Any person violating any of the provisions of this by-law shall for each and every offense be liable upon summary conviction thereof to a penalty of not more than \$500.00 exclusive of costs and in default of payment of fine and costs to imprisonment for six six (6) months.
- 4) This by-law shall take effect on the day of the final reading thereof.

BY-LAW NO. 99

DOMESTIC ANIMAL BYLAW OF
THE NEW TOWN OF RAINBOW LAKE

WHEREAS The Council of the New Town of Rainbow Lake wishes to
Regulate and control domestic animals, and

WHEREAS under Section 161 of the Municipal Government Act
Being Chapter 246 of the Revised Statute of Alberta, 1970.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the New Town of Rainbow Lake
duly assembled enacts as follows:

Part 1

Definitions:

1. This bylaw may be cited as the New Town of Rainbow Lake Animal Control Bylaw.
 2. In this bylaw unless the context otherwise required, the word, term or expressions.
 - a) Town shall mean the municipal corporation of the New Town of Rainbow Lake.
 - b) "Town Council" or "council" shall mean the Board of Administrators for the Municipal Corporation of the new Town of Rainbow Lake in the Province of Alberta.
 - c) "Domestic Animal" means a horse, mule, ass, head of cattle, sheep, pig, goat, chicken, turkey, goose, fowl or poultry of any kind.
- DO "Owner" means the person who has the legal title of the Domestic animal of any kind and also any person who has possession or custody of the domestic animal.

Part II

1. This bylaw shall not apply and shall not restrict the applicability of the Dog Control Bylaw #45 of the New Town of Rainbow Lake.
2. No person shall keep or cause or suffer to be kept save as hereinafter provided any domestic animal within the limits of the New Town of Rainbow Lake.

3. No person shall lead, ride, or drive any domestic animal in the limits of the Town.
4. Domestic Animals in Town for parades or exhibition, under the care and supervision of competent persons are not subject to the provisions of this bylaw.
5. Birds or poultry being part of any commercial undertaking which is established with the approval of the Town Council shall not be subject to the provisions of this bylaw.
6. The keeping of pigeons and rabbits in the New Town of Rainbow Lake is not permitted in numbers greater than four on residential property and providing that the pens are kept in a clean and sanitary condition and further providing that if complaints or damage is proven the person owning the said pigeons or rabbits to restrain same or destroy same. Special approval may be granted by Council for the keeping of rabbits or pigeons on larger parcels of land within the Town.

Part III

1. A notice or form similar to the one described in Section 49, of the Regulations under the Highway Traffic Act may be issued by a dog catcher, animal control officer, or pound keeper to any person charged with a breach of any provisions of this bylaw and the said notice shall require the payment to such official or officials as the Town may designate of the sum shown thereupon.
 - a) Nothing within this section shall restrict the persons right to plead not guilty and have the case heard before a Magistrate, Judge or Justice of the Peace.
2. Any person guilty of a violation of provision of this bylaw where a voluntary fine is not paid shall be liable on conviction before a Magistrate, Judge or Justice of the Peace, to the penalties as designated by the Town Council, but in no case shall such penalty be less than that which would have been specified upon voluntary payments.

This By-law comes to force on the 15th day after it is finally passed.
